Nunavut Arctic College (NAC)

Nunavut Arctic College (NAC) was founded in 1995. It now has three campuses: Nunatta Campus in Iqaluit; Kitikmeot Campus in Iqaluktuuttiaq (Cambridge Bay); Kivalliq Campus in Kangiqliniq (Rankin Inlet); and 24 Community Learning Centres. Nunavut Arctic College is an active member of the international University of the Arctic. NAC is a rapidly-growing institution with the world's largest catchment area across three time-zones. For some degree programs, it has partnered with southern Canadian universities.

Nunavut Research Institute (NRI)

The Nunavut Research Institute (NRI) is a division of NAC with research facilities in Iqaluit, Arviat, Iqaluktuuttiaq, Kangiqliniq, and Igloolik. Among other tasks, the NRI is responsible for licencing research in Nunavut. This control is necessary to ensure that every research project is for the benefit of the Inuit people, and that the relevant community is fully informed of any project in its vicinity, and of its outcome.
